- SOME CHURCH PROBLEMS ENCOUNTERED -

- A church leader caught stealing funds: the Board was ready to forgive without repayment. EMBEZZLEMENT GOSSIP - Satan's three-pronged dart dividing churches. Gossip is now being called "sharing time". DISAGREEMENT - As to how a church platform should be constructed. - As to whether crackers or bread be served. COMMUNION BOARD MEMBERS - A Board Member angry because other Board Members walking over his just seeded grass **FIGHTING** and he sat in on board meetings with an angry spirit which helped lead to a church split. SOCIAL DRINKING - Church divided over use of intoxicating beverages. HOMOSEXUALITY - Church divided over a youth leader thought to be a homosexual, others thought otherwise. - Church split over belief in immersion against other views. The only time that BRM recom-BAPTISM mended a church split and they did with BRM's assistance for each side. - A church with too many hands on the steering wheel and by-passing Scriptural chain-of-CHAIN-OFcommand as outlined in the Scriptures leaving the pastor as a spectator. COMMAND **OWNERSHIP OF** A pastor resigning and then refusing to leave the parsonage feeling it was his for life. **PARSONAGE** - A church tolerating a few of their members to sell Bible study tapes with an encouragement HOME WORSHIP to stay home instead of attending God's House for worship. A case of "tape worm". BOARD MEMBERS - A church split over Board Members arguing over the purchase of a water softener. Loved ones of each Board member took sides and it ended up in a divided church. **FIGHTING** - Church members circulating a petition to oust the pastor without any constitutional **PETITIONS** authority to do so. PASTOR ABANDONS - Begging BRM to help break a deadlock in his church and taking a leave of absence for a few days leaving BRM with the problem. PROBLEM

CHURCH BOARD and PASTOR - Disagreement over the purchasing of a home for the pastor to build up equity. Financing the project and it's location proved a testing time for the church board.

SUING

- A construction worker and members of a church which he intended to sue because of a minor accident which required outpatient care. He wanted a nice nest egg.

RETIREMENT

A church which reneged on it's promise of retirement income after almost three decades of faithful service by the pastor and his wife.

DOCTRINE

- A pastor who changed his doctrinal views and began preaching his new ideas from the pulpit without forewarning his Board resulted in problems among the congregation.

VOTE ON PASTOR

- A church with an ungodly clause in their set-up allowing an annual vote on the pastor.

Mrs. Syoboda has often asked her husband to write a book with more information on above happenings. His reply has been "Who would believe it?" The statistics are mind boggling. It is estimated that there are some 15,000 church splits annually in America with a 20% pastor burn-out.
